

REGULAR MEETING OF THE OLIVER TOWNSHIP BOARD October 6, 2015 at 7:00 PM

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Meeting was called to order by Supervisor Larry Krohn.

Members present Larry Krohn, Robert Krohn Tom Ziel Alfredo Santos, and Jeanette Renn.

It was moved by Jeanette Renn, supported by Alfredo Santo that the minutes of the Sept 8, 2015 meeting be approved as read, motion carried.

Treasurers' report was given, approximately \$209,902.00 on hand in the general fund.

Fire Chief reported on fire runs: 1 power line down, 1 P.I. accident, and 2 lift assists with the ambulance personnel, also presented bills for the month. Chief reported on the old house south of Elkton that they burned down for training. The house contained asbestos siding, hazmat crew from the State is cleaning up the asbestos debris. Also chief reported that the confinement system is not up and running as yet.

No site permits were issued for the month.

Paul Funk, representing DTE gave a report on the wind project in the Township stating that everything is moving forward as scheduled, also answered many questions the public had asked about the project.

Convention registration, Jeanette Renn will make reservations for the rooms after registration is done.

Planning commission chairman, Brion Dickens, reported on updating the master plan for the Township. He would like Spicer Group to oversee it, after discussion it was moved by Tom Ziel, supported by Robert Krohn that we hire Spicer Group at a maximum of \$3000.00 to update the master plan and zoning ordinances, motion carried.

Rich Swartzendruber, commissioner, gave his report. The county planning commission will present its final ordinance update on wind energy, moratorium is still in effect. Also discussed different county level concerns.

Tony Rutkowski, assessor, reported he is still getting use to his new laptop.

Supervisor handed out the work sheet from the Road Commission on what was done in the township for the 2015.

Discussion on graveling or stoning Geiger Rd .issue was tabled until later date.

It was moved by Alfredo Santos, supported by Tom Ziel that we reduce the millage rate to the Pigeon District Library by .0010 that would set the rate at .0015, motion carried.
