Supervisor, Tom Ziel opened the meeting at approximately 7 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance at township hall. Members and guests present; Tom Ziel, Adam Herford, Steve Vaughan, Jim Seley, Gary Sweeney and Bob Ross.
